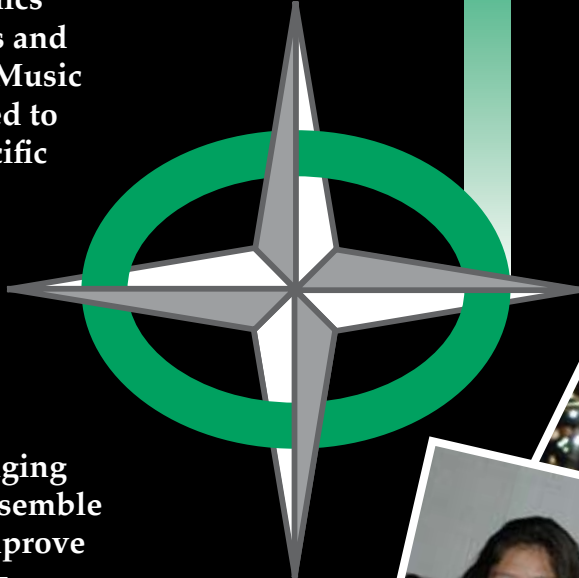

SJYO Symphony Orchestra • Featuring a full complement of strings, woodwinds, brass, and percussion, this advanced group performs challenging classical and contemporary compositions from Bach, Mozart, Copland, Mancini, Smith, and more.

SJYO Strings Ensemble

A group dedicated to developing the skills of strings musicians. Members learn the dynamics of ensemble performances and get opportunities to solo. Music selections are often tailored to take advantage of the specific abilities of its members.



SJYO Jazz Ensemble

Primarily for brass and woodwinds, but also engaging other instruments, this Ensemble helps young musicians improve their abilities through Jazz. Students learn basic Jazz theory and develop improvisation skills.

The SJYO provides a challenging, enjoyable environment for young musicians to develop their skills. Students from around the area meet for Monday night rehearsals, practicing in sections and as a full orchestra. Experienced conductors prepare for performances, but also teach music theory and discuss entertaining historical facts about compositions and composers. Young artists get a taste of professional orchestra experience, while working with and meeting other talented musicians.
